Why do people move?

I was reading an article the other day on why people move, and the top reasons given were to get a better or larger home, to take a new job, or to get into a better neighborhood. We are blessed in "the Bend" as we have both original and new construction homes available, we are close to a lot of major employers, and we have a vibrant community coupled with exemplary schools!

What's going on in the real estate market?

According to the NAR's chief economist, the two main factors driving home sales are inventory availability and mortgage rates. Nationally this year, there

are a million less homes on the market than last year. This low level of inventory has pushed some home prices higher in desirable neighborhoods like ours.

The high mortgage rates have caused hesitation by some buyers and sellers resulting in less homes bought and sold this year compared to last year. Interestingly, cash buyers have played a larger role in the 2023 market than in the last few years.

The good news is that most homeowners continue to enjoy large wealth gains from recent years of appreciation. From 1990-2023, single family home appreciation has gone up by 311%. Since 2000, it has gone up by 172%, and since 2020 it has gone up by 33.2% (NAR). In West Memorial, our average sales price is \$759,000, up from an average of \$677,000 last year.

How is the market in Memorial Bend?

In "the Bend" we currently have 4 homes for sale, 2 pending/under contract and 6 sold in the past 6 months. The most expensive new construction home sold for over \$2M. Original home sales prices ranged from \$550,000 to \$935,000, and this price differential largely depends on the location of the home in our neighborhood and recent improvements made to the home.




Memorial Bend Club News


